

BRAYMER GIRLS WIN CONSOLATION

The Braymer girls' basketball team began their portion of the Braymer Invitational Tournament matched up against a very talented Hardin Central team. A solid 1st quarter kept Braymer close as they trailed 14-18 after one period, but poor shooting by the Bobcats allowed Hardin to pull ahead 35-16 at halftime. Scoring woes continued for the home team in the 3rd quarter as Hardin went up by a score of 53-21, but a big 4th quarter led by Foley let Braymer end the game solidly. Final score Hardin 63 - Braymer 40. The Bobcats were led in scoring by Molly Foley with 23, while Leigh Anne Jordan had 8 and Carlie Adams 7. Keely DeBolt rounded out the scoring for Braymer with 2 points.

Dropping into the consolation bracket for the second round, the Lady Bobcats found the Maysville JV as their opponent. The Maysville JV squad was a last minute substitution for Lone Jack who dropped out of the tournament. The Braymer girls jumped out to an early 17-9 lead after the first quarter and stretched it to 28-16 at halftime. Maysville outscored them by 4 points in the 3rd quarter to trim the lead to 32-24, but the Ladycats held on at the end to win their first game of the season 38-32.

Keely DeBolt led Braymer with 12 points while Molly Foley added 8. Leigh Anne Jordan, Carlie Adams and Jacie O'Dell each provided 6 points while Melanie Dinwiddie did not score but played valuable minutes for Coach Barnes.

The consolation game was another rematch for the Lady Bobcats as they faced a Stet team that had defeated them in the season opener. Braymer's girls were eager to show their fans how much they had improved so far and jumped out to an 11-2 advantage after one period. A nice 2nd quarter where Braymer outscored Stet by 4 points allowed the host team to go to the locker room with a 24-11 lead. The Lady Bobcats continued to score well in the last two frames and finished with their 3rd consecutive win by a score of 47-33.

Molly Foley again led all Braymer scorers with 15 points followed by Jacie O'Dell with 13, Carlie Adams with 10 and Leigh Anne Jordan with 9.
