

Thursday night the Braymer Lady Bobcats traveled to Osborn for a rematch of their game 3 contest. In the original meeting, the Lady Wildcats handled the young team from Braymer relatively easily. On Thursday night they got a firsthand view of just how much this group has improved since the season began.
