BRAYMER C-4 SCHOOL DRESS CODE

The purpose of the dress code is to ensure that all students are able to attend school in a safe and distraction-free environment. It is not the school's intention to infringe on individual student rights, but rather encourage students to "dress for success" and to come to school prepared to participate in the learning process. The dress code is intended to provide guidelines for parents and students in selecting appropriate school attire. Teachers and administrators will use their professional judgment regarding decisions of proper dress. *The dress code is to be followed at all school activities, both home and away.*

STUDENT DRESS AND GROOMING WILL BE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE INDIVIDUAL AND PARENTS/GUARDIANS WITHIN THESE GUIDELINES:

1. Dress and grooming will be clean and in keeping with health, sanitary and safety requirements.
2. Pants should be worn at or above the hip. "Sagging" is not allowed. At no time may undergarments or buttocks be visible.
3. Shirts must be of proper length and buttoned appropriately. No bare midriff, cleavage, navel, or undergarments may be showing. Spaghetti strap tops, tube tops and halter-tops are not allowed. Shirts must have at least a two-inch strap over each shoulder.
4. Skirts and shorts must extend to the mid-thigh. No holes may be above the mid-thigh to the waistband of the article of clothing.
5. No pajama pants or lounging pants.
6. Clothing that displays alcohol, tobacco products, illegal drugs, drug paraphernalia, sexual content, violent or aggressive acts or having suggestive "double meaning" slogans are not allowed.
7. NO hats, hoods, bandannas, caps, or any other headgear are allowed while in the school building or any indoor activities sponsored by Braymer C-4 or other District except under special circumstances to be determined by the administration. They are to be removed when entering the building and KEPT in the lockers until the final bell.
8. Distracting hairstyles will not be allowed. Hair should be neat and clean.
9. No visible tattoos. No body piercing permitted with the exception of a maximum of three earrings in each ear for all students.

Consequences for breaking dress code:

Dress Code Violation – Any class time missed due to dress code problems will result in no credit for time missed and will be counted as an absence from the class. If a student refuses to give up requested item or change inappropriate clothing, OSS will result immediately. Students will be given a school shirt to wear if they are unable to find someone to bring them a change of clothes.

1st Offense: Confiscation or required to change clothes immediately. Parents contacted.

2nd Offense: Parent contacted by phone. Parent will need to pick student up immediately to take home and correct violation. If a student drives, a parent must give permission for student to leave school grounds to correct the violation. After school detention.

Subsequent Offenses: Parent contacted by phone. Parent will need to pick the student up immediately to take home and correct the violation. Up to 3 days ISS will be assigned. If a student drives, a parent must give permission for student to leave school grounds to correct the violation.
