# Title I Schoolwide Program Handbook

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Braymer C-4 Elementary is a schoolwide title school. This means that all Braymer elementary students have the opportunity to receive supplemental



services provided by the Title I teacher if adequate progress is not being made in the classroom. Participation in the Title I services may be based on annual test scores and/or formative assessment data from the classroom. The classroom teacher will meet with the Title I teacher regularly to discuss and determine student needs. The staff will work together to address areas of deficiency in essential outcomes appropriate for each grade level.

As partners in education the students, parents, and school staff agree to work together to improve student academic achievement.

## Title I Components

- Title I teacher works closely with the regular classroom teacher in order to plan instruction.
- Title I curriculum follows Missouri Learning Standards.
- Reading and writing instruction will consist of the five essential areas: phonemic awareness, phonics, vocabulary development, reading fluency, and reading comprehension strategies.
- A variety of teaching methods will be used for instruction.
- Both the pull-out model and the push-in model will be used for instruction, with extra reading instruction lasting 25 minutes each day.
- Parent Involvement will be utilized as parents are the key to their child's success.

## Curriculum

Our curriculums are a multisensory, structured, sequential, diagnostic and perspective way to teach literacy. This is the same approach as Orton-Gillingham, which is highly recommended for students who struggle with reading, writing and spelling or have dyslexia. The 2 curriculums we use in Title I are the Souday System and Really Great Reading.



## Parent Involvement

Parents are a vital part of the Title I Reading Program. Parents will be invited to participate in their child's education through the following activities:

- Annual Meeting
- Surveys
- Participate in various meetings-open house, and/or Literacy nights

## Parent Resource Center

- We have several resources to help reinforce reading skills at home.
